2015. Old San Ysidro Church, Corrales, NM. Remove the concrete plinth in the sacristy and underping the northeast corner using helical piers and reversible structural steel; strip and all earlier layers of mud plaster; perform repairs to the adobe walls throughout; apply two to three mud leveling coats and a final coat of mud plaster. Treat all exterior woodwork. All work done in compliance with Section 106 of the Secretary of Interior's Standards and approved by the New Mexico Historic Preservtion Division.

2015. Jemez Kiva, Jemez State Monument, Jemez Springs, NM. Remove and replace the deteriorated roof including the installation of hand-scorped vigas, columns and latillas, and the replication of the historic ladder.

2014-2015. Acoma Pueblo, NM. Stabilization and restoration of the failed walls in the "schoolhouse" component of the convent (ca. 1641). Stabilized and re-roofed three historic buildings around the main dance plaza.

2014. O'Keefe House, Abiquiu, NM. Conducted in-depth assessment of the Home and Studio in Abiquiu. Restored the adobe and wooden entry and installed a basal wall interceptor drain.

Stabilization, partial reconstruction, archeological monitoring, and complete 100-year restoration, sub-floor to bell towers, of a massive adobe mission church built in 1612. <u>Awards</u>: Recipient of 2013 National Trust for Historic Preservation Honor Award, one of only 10 awarded nationally. Recipient of a 2012 New Mexico Architectural Heritage Preservation Award for the "culturally sensitive and inspiring restoration of St. Agustine Church."

Emergency *replacement of failed roof, including protecting historic painted* murals; replacing five massive vigas; reconstruction of watertight earthen roof; and rebuilding adobe walls and timber ladder.

2009. Fort Stanton Administration/Museum Building Renovation, Fort Stanton, NM, for State of New Mexico. Complete restoration, in strict accordance with National Parks Historic Preservation Guidelines, of an historically significant building, built in 1855 and on the National Historic Register. <u>Award:</u> Recipient of the 2010 New Mexico Heritage Preservation Award for Architectural Heritage.
