

V-SITE COMPLEX MANHATTAN PROJECT



The V-Site Restoration Project was honored with the 2008 National Trust/Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's Award for Federal Partnerships in Historic Preservation and a 2007 New Mexico Heritage Preservation Award for Architectural Heritage.

PROJECT:

Arguably one of the more important sites of the 20th century, the Victory Site complex at Los Alamos National Labs is where the first atomic weapon was assembled.

PROBLEM:

Vacated at the end of the Manhattan Project, the V-Site buildings were quickly eroding and in danger of collapse. All but two of the buildings were lost in the Cerro Grande fire of 2000.



SOLUTION:

In collaboration with Los Alamos National Labs and the Department of Energy, Crocker Ltd provided on-site preservation expertise for the stabilization and preservation of the remaining buildings.
